




# Current Data



- As of April 10, 2025: 712 confirmed cases reported in the United States. For all of 2024, there were 285 confirmed cases.
- 11% of cases have been hospitalized and 97% has occurred in unvaccinated people.
- New Mexico has had 63 confirmed cases (as of 4/15/25)
- Texas has had 561 confirmed cases (as of 4/15/25)
- Oklahoma has had 12 cases (as of 4/15/25)



# UNDERSTANDING MEASLES



- Measles is making headlines again. This highly contagious disease can be serious, even life-threatening, especially for those who are unvaccinated.
- Measles spreads when an infected person coughs, sneezes, or breathes near you. It's vital to ensure you are protected.
- Two doses of the MMR vaccine give the best protection against measles.
- Check your immunization records to see if you're covered!



# MEASLES SYMPTOMS



- If you notice any of these signs, take precautions:
- High fever
- Cough
- Runny nose
- Red, watery eyes
- Rash
- If you're experiencing any symptoms, wear a mask and call the clinic before visiting. Our SHAC nurses will help guide you on how to get the care you need safely.
